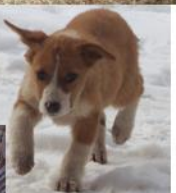


### Honey and pups shot

We were still looking for Honey at the start of February and also her pup that had gone missing a month before. We had found one dead pup and thought it had been hit by a car. We then found another pup dead and another one missing, leaving just one little girl, on her own. We were informed by a young boy that Honey and all the other pups had been shot and killed by a man, from his apartment window. The boy was afraid to tell the police what he had seen. People warned us against going to the police, saying it could cause trouble for us and they wouldn't be interested. Nobody would come with us to translate. We did have a meeting with the police chief and he was very good. He supports what we are doing and says he will help us all he can. Without a witness, he couldn't arrest and charge the person who had shot Honey and her pups, but he did serve him with a written police warning.

Bella, the remaining pup, was doing well until last week when she wouldn't eat or get up. We don't know what happened to her but she was very scared and seemed to have given up the will to live. After a worrying few days, she started to improve and is now the playful, bouncy pup that she used to be.

He said he didn't want her anymore and to give her to the boy she was following. She was so hungry that she had been killing hens and was in danger of being shot. She is now staying with us. She is very attached to the boys. If she can't be with them, she goes into a total panic and howls and barks.



The papers for registration as a charitable foundation, have been signed and lodged with the court. In a few weeks we should have our charity number.

A fantastic group of ladies in Holland have worked very hard and set up a support group to help our dogs. They are looking for foster homes and forever homes for some of them. Snoopy, Wolfy, Lulah and Bella are going to be micro chipped and vaccinated, next week and will have passports. It is hoped they will be the first dogs to go to new homes in Holland.
