We have started our own petition so that we can show officials that we have support from people all over the world and that they are aware of our situation here and in support of what we do. When Lily turned back up at the house, in season and being followed by male dogs, we hoped she had come to us before she got caught. Everything was against us in our attempts to get her spayed. Our own vet who was away receiving training in spaying, decided he was staying in the city. We then found a vet 5/6 hours away who would spay, but when we tried to make an appointment, he couldn't fit her in. Then the brakes went on the van, so we had no way of getting her there. A couple of weeks ago we thought she might be bagging up but her belly didn't seem to be any bigger so we were hoping it was a false pregnancy. Well she has settled any doubts by giving birth to two pups. This just shows how much we really do need a shelter. We have no catching facilities, nowhere to put any dogs if we were able to catch them and nowhere for them to recover. With a shelter we could arrange for a vet to come out and neuter/spay so many dogs at a time. There are 5 female street dogs near to our house, all at breeding age. So many more pups will be born to a life of suffering of abuse.
