- Sadly there is still no sign of any of the missing forest dogs. We still go up and leave food in the huts and it is always gone the next day. We have seen paw tracks on several occasions. Recently we saw two dogs but were unable to get close to them. We did put food out for them and hope that eventually they will learn to trust.
- Earlier this week, we saw two very thin young dogs on the road 5km out of town. Again these dogs were very scared and the most we could was put food down for them. Today they have appeared not far from our house and we are trying desperately to coax them into the garden.

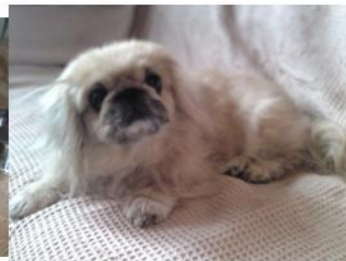
3 new dogs
